Here are a few of the ongoing volunteer needs: *Volunteer Coordinator*

This person maintains the volunteer list; works with event leads to determine volunteer needs and communicates with volunteers on all event logistics; and, maintains communication with volunteers on regular basis. We need someone with strong interpersonal, communication, and organizational skills who is comfortable with email, text, and phone calls.

Special Event Coordinator(s)

We need a team of 4-6 people who enjoy event planning and successful execution. Each event coordinator will handle 1-2 events per year (or more, if desired). Event planning includes but is not limited to: communication with the FOL leadership team on needs for specific special events; research and identification of even venues, logistics, etc.; coordination with the FOL treasurer on event costs; working with the volunteer coordinator to determine volunteer needs and availability; event advertising, publicity, etc.
